

## Stefan REICHMUTH

*Professor of Arabic and Islamic Studies  
Ruhr University Bochum (Allemagne)*

The primary research interest of Stefan Reichmuth is on the modern period starting in the 16th century, in a comparative and transregional perspective which includes the Middle East and North Africa, Sub-Saharan Africa, and South Asia.

His research has covered different regions of the Muslim world and includes the following areas: Islamic Learning and Arabic Literature in Africa; The Islamic world of the Early Modern Period in transregional perspective; Mysticism, Science and Medicine in Muslim societies; Unani Medicine in South Asia.

He published *Islamische Bildung und soziale Integration in Ilorin (Nigeria) seit ca. 1800* (1998), *The World of Murtada al-Zabidi (1732-91). Life, Networks, and Writings* (2009), and co-edited *Islamic Education in the Soviet Union and its Successor States* (2010).

Since 2002, he has been chief editor of the journal *Die Welt des Islams*.
